NEW MEMBER FEE CHANGES

As of October 1, 2013, new members will pay a fixed fee regardless of the date they join Kiwanis.

This enrollment fee for clubs tier A nations, including the U.S. and Canada, will pay US\$50 for each new member.

Kiwanis used a prorated system for the past several years to encourage membership growth later in the year. The practice, however, has not affected new-member additions.

To restore an important revenue stream and balance the budget, the fixed new-member enrollment fee is reinstated.

then led the members and guests in benediction.



It is also one of the few items that the Food Bank does not get a discount on when buying. One of the charter members, Tim Finnen, a Navy Recruiter, asked his future recruits to present jars of peanut butter at their monthly meeting. This endeavor made national news when an article was submitted to the Navy Recruiter Magazine. The story was also posted online at the Navy's News Service site, click here to read it. To date the Market Street Kiwanis Club have collected more than 1,100 pounds of peanut butter!

Youth Protection Annual Training Now Required of Clubs

Young Children Priority One

Greetings Mighty T-O District! My name is Dennis Hogan and I have been appointed as our District's Youth Protection Manager. I am a member of the Terrell Kiwanis Club which is in Division 2. I also serve as the District Administrator for Builders Club for our district as well as the Region 8 Advisor for Key Club. The safety of the children of our district is my number one priority as it is yours as well I am sure. I would like to take this opportunity to inform you of a change from Kiwanis International that will take effect on October 1, 2013.

In 2007, Kiwanis came up with a set of guidelines for youth protection. They have been periodically updated as needed with the latest update set to take effect on October 1. The youth protection guidelines for the Texas-Oklahoma District mirror these new guidelines from Kiwanis International. The major change is that clubs will be required to be trained in the Youth Protection Guidelines. Beginning with the club report that is filed for October 2013, the secretary will be asked if their club has participated in this training. In the September 2014 report, the club secretary will be

required to verify participation in the Youth Protection Guidelines training. Therefore, clubs will be given one year to complete the initial training. After that, clubs will be required to participate in annual training of these guidelines. In regards to the criminal background checks, any adult attending an International event will still have to have a background check performed by Kiwanis International. Our District background checks will not work for International events.

In regard to the Youth Protection guideline, the guidelines as well as the training materials can be found at <u>www.kiwanisone.org/youth protection</u>. If you like, you can download the materials and conduct the training for your club yourself. I will be glad to assist you in the training myself.
